

Changing Landscape of Asian-Owned Businesses in Massachusetts

Growth of Asian-owned businesses consistently outpaced that of all Massachusetts firms.

Percent change in revenue for Asian-owned and all businesses in Massachusetts.


All MA Firms Asian-Owned MA Firms

Growth of Asian-owned businesses in Massachusetts outpaced that of Asian-owned businesses nationwide.


Percent change in number of Asian-owned and all firms between 2002 and 2017.

The share of local firm employees hired by Asian-owned businesses doubled.


Employees hired by Asian, Black, Latino and White-owned businesses as a share of employees of all Massachusetts-based firms. Massachusetts.


Paid employees hired by Asian-owned businesses increased by 150%.

Percent of Asian entrepreneurs in a given industry. Massachusetts. 2017-2021.




Asian Entrepreneurs by Industry

Asian entrepreneurs are overrepresented in personal service and medical businesses.


Share of Asian entrepreneurs in select sectors. Massachusetts. 2017-2021.



Share of Asian Entrepreneurs in Select Sectors


Ongoing Challenges

Inflation and getting capital are two primary concerns for Asian-owned businesses.




Share of Asian small business owners who list a given challenge as a major concern. Massachusetts. 2022.


Asian-owned businesses are more likely to report concern with wages keeping up with inflation.

Share of small business owners who said wages keeping up with inflation is a major concern by race/ethnicity. MA. 2022.




Asian-owned businesses are more likely to report difficulty finding qualified and reliable employees.

Three-quarters of Asian-owned businesses reported concern about gaining access to capital.


Share of small business owners who getting capital is a major concern by race/ethnicity. MA. 2022.


Asian-owned businesses were less likely to receive technical assistance.

Has your company received assistance, coaching, or advice in the last 12 months?




Asian-owned businesses are less likely to be familiar with technical assistance.

Asian-owned businesses could use assistance accessing capital funds and new revenue sources.


Share of small business owners who say each kind of technical assistance would be "useful." Massachusetts. 2022.
