WELCOME LETTER FROM ACF LEADERSHIP

In the 1870s, the first Asian residents—namely Chinese laborers from California—came to Massachusetts to work at the Sampson's Shoe Factory in North Adams. They, like the immigrants that followed from India, Vietnam, South Korea, Cambodia, the Philippines, and other countries, demonstrated great strength and tenacity in the face of anti-immigrant sentiment, hostility, and exclusionary policies. While the migration pathways and lived experiences of Asian communities vary greatly, our stories and collective prosperity remain intrinsically linked.

Today, Asian Americans are the fastest growing and most diverse racial group in Greater Boston, contributing billions of dollars to the Massachusetts economy. And yet for far too long, our community has been marginalized and overlooked. In fact, over the past 30 years, a mere 0.2% of total philanthropic funding has gone to support AAPI residents.

The Asian Community Fund (ACF) at the Boston Foundation was launched in 2020 to address many of the historic hurdles facing local AAPI communities and to help galvanize our collective power. Since our inception, we have convened over 4,000 residents across our events, catalyzed new community coalitions, and strengthened the capacity of our AAPI nonprofit sector by deploying over \$1,000,000 in grants to date.

This year's Inaugural Gala represents an important milestone in this historic effort to amplify AAPI leadership and philanthropy. ACF aims to be the connective tissue that unifies our region's rich landscape of AAPI residents, businesses, and community organizations. We see a future where AAPI residents across Massachusetts and our neighbors overcome systemic gaps in health and wealth, and thrive together.

We can't do this work alone—and in partnership with our nonprofit and business partners, government leaders, and donor community, we are creating a future where AAPI residents have the opportunity to build social, economic, political, and cultural capital. We hope you will join us in building and sustaining this movement. Together, we can achieve belonging and prosperity for all who call Massachusetts home.

She serves on the Board of Directors for the Massachusetts Coalition for the Homeless, The Partnership, and the United Way of Massachusetts Bay.





AAPI HONOREE

GEETA AIYER

Founder & President

Boston Common Asset Management

Geeta Aiyer, President and Founder of Boston Common Asset Management, will be recognized as the inaugural AAPI Honoree for her remarkable work as an entrepreneur, business leader, and social activist, whose advocacy spans environmental and social justice.

When Aiyer created Boston Common Asset Management in 2003, she was inspired by the belief that public equity investing is the most effective vehicle for generating corporate impact because equity ownership gives investors a voice with unique access to company management. Under Aiyer's leadership, Boston Common Asset Management, which managed \$4.3B in assets as of June 30, has built a strong investment record and meaningfully improved the policies and practices of portfolio companies through proactive shareholder engagement. A member of the South Asian-American community, Aiyer has outstanding achievements in championing business equity and women's leadership and continues to be recognized for her efforts in promoting social and environmental responsibility both nationally and globally.

In 2022 she was awarded TiE Boston's Lifetime Achievement Award, and in 2023 TIME named Aiyer, to the inaugural TIME I 00 Climate list, recognizing the I 00 most innovative leaders driving business climate action.

From 2015-2017, Aiyer was on the Board of UN PRI, becoming the first US asset manager elected to serve. Today, she serves on the boards of the Natural Resources Defense Council's (NRDC) and the Interfaith Center on Corporate Responsibility (ICCR). She is also the Chair and Co-Founder of Direct Action for Women Now Worldwide (DAWN), a nonprofit that works with local organizations to address gender-based violence.

Bob Rivers, Executive Chair and Chair of the Board of Directors at Eastern Bank, will be recognized as the inaugural Ally Honoree for his committed partnership and advocacy in supporting AAPI communities and entrepreneurs of color.

A 40-year community banker who started his career as a teller, he is a graduate of Stonehill College. In addition to his leadership of Eastern Bank, Greater Boston's leading local bank and the largest bank-owned independent investment advisor in Massachusetts, Rivers is involved extensively in the community. He serves on the Board of Directors of the Greater Boston Chamber of Commerce, Massachusetts Business Roundtable, The Lowell Plan, and The New England Council. He also is a member of the Board of Trustees of Stonehill College, the Advisory Boards of the JFK Library Foundation, Lawrence Partnership and UTEC, as well as the Boston Women's Workforce Council and The Boston Club, in addition to providing support and guidance to numerous other non-profit organizations.

Rivers also serves as a Co-Chair of the Massachusetts Business Coalition for Early Childhood Education, comprised of more than 100 Massachusetts companies and business associations focused on raising awareness about the need for a more robust and sustainable network of early childcare and education. A co-founder of Eastern's innovation hub, Eastern Labs, which has pioneered new products with fintech's and advanced digital banking services, Bob also serves on the Advisory Board of the Mass FinTech Hub. In 2023, he was appointed to the Federal Reserve's Federal Advisory Council. Rivers has been recognized by many organizations for his work in championing diversity and social justice and has been regularly named among the Top 10 "Most Influential People in Boston" by Boston Magazine, and to the Boston Business Journal's Power 50 list.
