





Financial & Social Significance of Arts, Culture & Scientific Organizations in Metro Denver

- \$1.8 billion in economic activity generated by cultural organizations
- \$512 million in economic impact new money
- 3.9 million students in 2015
- Generated 10,731 jobs
- 13.9 million people attended cultural events
- \bullet Free attendance at the cultural went up 3%, while paid attendance went down 9%
- Majority of SCFD organizations provide cultural opportunities for free throughout the year. Without SCFD support, most report that these free days and activities would not be possible.
- Colorado ranks top in the country for classical music concert, dance and theater performance and art museum attendance. NEA's Survey of Public Participation in the Arts
